














Come on over in Winter

Lord Howe Island enjoys a very mild winter — the temperature is hardly ever cooler than 16°C, and frosts are unknown. Activities that can be enjoyed are hiking and bushwalking, bike riding, bowls, golf, tennis, photography, and for an experience that's really different — something few people have ever done before — you can take a stroll to Ned's Beach where you can stand knee-deep and crumble bread in the crystal clear water and watch the fish swim in for their share. They're free sea creatures, but they've become so tame they'll eat out of your hand.

We on Lord Howe believe we have the southernmost coral reef in the world, our water is CLEAR, our beaches are clean, the air is CRISP and pollution free. We have many indigenous plants and trees, and of course we have our woodhen. Lord Howe Island is UNIQUE, and because of these things and many more, Lord Howe Island has recently been included in the 'World Heritage Organisation'.

Fishing? You've never really been fishing until you've dropped a line into the deep waters off Lord Howe Island, where kingfish, tuna, mackerel and marlin abound. These are fighting fish, lean and hungry, and when they snap at the bait you know you're on to something big! Good fishing is to be had from the rocks and beach.
